Susan is a director of Trust Investments Management Limited, an investment and property company and Ospri, the farmer-owned animal disease management agency, and is also a Director of Accessible Properties, the property arm of IHC and on the group wide Audit, Investment and Risk Committee. She is a member of the NZ Institute of Directors Nomination Committee and a Trustee of Hāto Petera Wāwāhi Ara which is repurposing the Māori boys boarding school in Northcote, Auckland.
