Purpose

The purpose of this Health and Safety (H&S) plan is to ensure Contact Energy and the visiting party have a shared understanding of the visit scope, the key site and activity risks, and the controls required to manage those risks. It also confirms how we will communicate before and during the visit (including any changes to conditions or activities), identifies the responsible persons and their roles (including site host and H&S contacts), and sets clear expectations for safe behaviours and compliance with site requirements.

Parking

Designated visitor parking is available at the site entrance to the right, please follow signs. See Site Map for reference.

- Vehicles to reverse park only.
- Arrival and departure will be supervised by site personnel to manage pedestrian and vehicle interactions.

PPE Requirements

Required from Students (per Connexis guidance):

- Closed toe shoes
- Long pants
- Long sleeve top
- Long hair tied back

Supplied by Contact Energy:

- Hi Vis vests
- Hard hats (as required)
- Safety glasses (as required)
- Hearing protection (as required)

Note: Students will not enter areas requiring safety footwear.

Supervision & Access Control

- This is a controlled group visit only – no unsupervised access.
 - All participants will receive a site induction on arrival.
 - Students and teachers remain with designated site escorts at all times.
 - Access limited to approved visitor routes and viewing areas only.
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Emergency Management

- Emergency procedures to be explained during induction.
 - Identified assembly point communicated to all attendees during induction and as per site map (Appendix 1).
 - In the event of site alarms and evacuation, follow Contact Energy protocols and site persons instructions.
 - Teachers remain responsible for pastoral care of students alongside site staff.
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Observation or Event Reporting

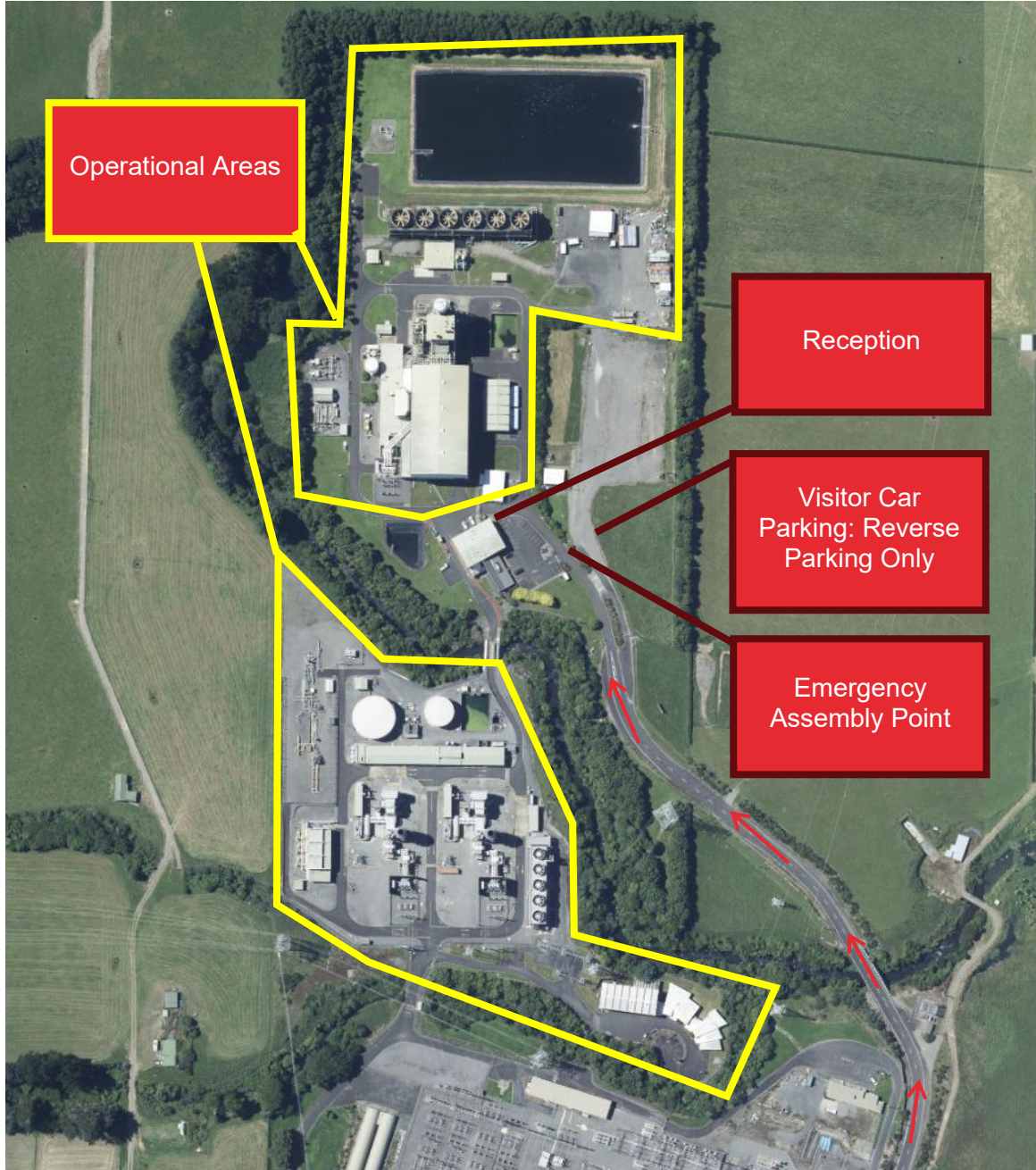
- Any event, observation or near miss should be reported to the event manager and/or site escort as soon as practicable.
